With a system consisting of over 90 independent dealers, the forklift group provides quality materials handling equipment to the broad North American market. Doosan Infracore America Forklift sellers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales places all through Canada and the U.S. The forklift product line impressively comprises of 63 distinctive models consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion vehicles. Capacities of these various vehicle designs range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are built in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest rising forklift and lift truck company in the North American marketplace, due to its exceptional level of product performance and their persistently high level of customer support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Lift Truck users. The U.S. lift Truck division situated in Cleveland has a expert team knowledgeable in Product Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

Initially the home-based forklift market in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. began in 1960, to import fully assembled lift trucks as part of a home-based machinery expansion project. Product sales of these products were originally targeted to state-run corporations, large scale businesses, and the military. This ultimately led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun business operations throughout Korea to service and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck manufacturing plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical education became the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Daewoo began the first home-based forklift business in 1967, and rapidly gained a whopping 90% share in the Korean Materials Handling market. By the 1980's, Daewoo's sophisticated technological improvements combined with sales success placed them in a position of significant expansion of their forklift business.

Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the U.S. in 1981, proposed a cooperative venture project to help them in the highly competitive North American materials handling industry. This project proved highly successful for Daewoo and their lift truck product sales expanded greatly. In 1984, the company completed development of a new facility to help in producing high end value-added products for export. In 1993, the corporation had a international sales network and started exporting versions they had developed through inhouse technology, as an sovereign brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing growth opportunities into international marketplaces.
